Curriculum and Assessment



All students at Hewens College have the opportunity to access a broad and balanced curriculum. Teaching and learning styles focus on providing a varied, challenging and stimulating learning environment. Our approach develops the critical learning skills students need to acquire to be successful learners. In addition we strongly believe that learning should not just be restricted to the classroom and as such offer a wide range of curriculum enrichment activities throughout the year.

In Key Stage 3, students benefit from bespoke facilities with Year 7 following National Curriculum subjects, including English, Mathematics, Science, Design and Information Technology, Humanities, French, Performing, Visual and Media Arts, and Physical Education and Sport. Literacy and numeracy skills are key to success and to develop these skills, students have lessons in English and Mathematics every day.

At Key Stage 4 a wide variety of academic and vocational courses are offered. As a member of The Rosedale Hewens Academy Trust, Hewens College is able to offer a broad curriculum package, which responds to the diverse needs, interests and aspirations of all our learners.

We believe homework in all subjects is crucial to support learning and achievement. Assignments are set for students on a regular basis to be undertaken at home so as to consolidate and extend the work completed in College; further developing key skills such as independent working, which is vital to academic success.

The College is committed to providing a comprehensive range of courses for Post 16 learners and has a vibrant and popular Post 16 Centre. The offer provides students with a wide range of academic and vocational courses, designed to meet the needs of all learners. Good quality teaching, along with high expectations and strong leadership, means students thrive in Post 16. The College has a proven track record of adding value to all the students' overall achievement, with many going on to undergraduate courses at university.

Students are given support and guidance on all aspects of their educational career, ranging from course choices and apprenticeship and training research to helping with university preparation.

Students are assessed by their subject teachers every half term and progress is measured against end of Key Stage targets. Parents, guardians and carers are kept informed of their child's progress throughout the academic year at 'Academic Review' meetings and through reports sent home. Students in examination years also benefit from practising trial examinations and past papers. The College has a wide ranging out of hours provision of additional support classes and intervention sessions.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

We believe very strongly in the importance of sport and exercise, as the benefits of leading an active and healthy lifestyle are endless. Regular participation in exercise or sport not only improves health levels, confidence levels and social relationships but studies show that it also leads to higher levels of academic attainment. For these reasons, the Physical Education curriculum is very broad and offers students as many different activities as possible during the two hours of physical education timetabled for students each week. During this time students are introduced to new sports, cover all aspects of the national Physical Education syllabus, acquire new techniques and refine skills already owned.

In addition to this, we present students with rich extra-curricular programmes after college that allows them to extend their interest and participation in sport and various clubs. Clubs range from social activities where students meet new friends within a healthy environment to more serious societies for those wishing to form a team and compete against other schools and colleges within the borough. Regardless of where our students fall within this continuum there is something for everyone and we encourage as many students as possible to take advantage of this and take steps to adopt and maintain an active and healthy lifestyle.

COLLEGE FACILITIES

The College benefits from having a small campus with a close community atmosphere. It has a high tech, floodlit synthetic pitch for sports and large outdoor spaces for learning and break times. Key Stage 3 students learn in their own designated spaces with each class having their own Teaching and Learning Associate who remains with them during their subject lessons.
