As part of their 'Safety Signs and Electronics' topic in Engineering, Year 9 students were presented with two challenges: to make a set of original dice that can be used to play board games, and to design and make a clock that has dual functions which can either be used as wall art or just a conventional clock. They were instructed to carry out their clock designs using a scroll saw, a band face sander and a pillar drill, employing a variety of design strategies including: marking out, measuring, cutting, sanding, painting and varnishing.
