


Public Health - Cases of Measles in Hillingdon

The local Public Health team has informed us that there has been a recent increase in the number of cases of Measles in Hillingdon. The cases all children aged 1 to 16, and all are unvaccinated. It is important that if a child is suspected of having measles, they do not attend school. They must telephone their GP or NHS 111.
