Exploring Forgotten Female Composers

On Thursday 5th May, 18 students visited the Barbican Centre to attend a symphonic concert organised and performed by London Symphony Orchestra.

The theme of the concert was 'Spark Catchers - the often-secret story of women composers' which explored the forgotten or neglected female composers from across the centuries.

The moderator exposed the students to various activities with the opportunity to experience a live orchestral performance - seeing and hearing different timbres and sonorities of orchestral instruments.

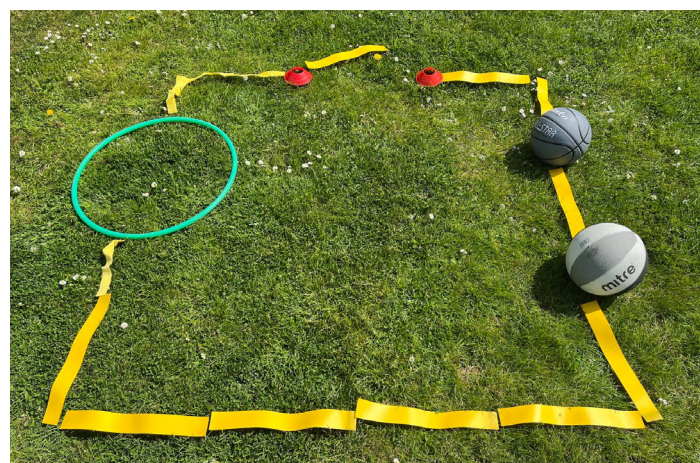
This trip enhanced and broadened the students' knowledge of music and challenged them to research the story behind the composers' masterpieces.
