They spent time in the 'Exploring Space' gallery where they saw a full-sized replica of the Eagle — the lander that took astronauts Armstrong and Aldrin to the Moon in 1969. They then moved onto the 'Who Am I' gallery where they explored the science of who we are through intriguing objects, provocative artworks and hands-on exhibits. Finally, the students visited the 'Engineer Your Future' gallery where they took part in challenges, games and films which helped them to understand what engineers do, and find out whether this could be a potential career prospect for them!

If students do need to have any such devices with them, they must hand them to the invigilation staff at the start of each examination. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the examination.

Students must attend the examination(s) for which they have been entered for. In the event of illness or an emergency situation that prevents your child attending or means your child will be late, please make contact with the College as soon as possible so that appropriate advice can be given and arrangements put in place.

Please note that your child's final examination grade will be adversely affected if he/she fails to attend a scheduled examination.
