



## What are the aims and intentions of this curriculum?

The aim of our Key Stage 4 curriculum is to inspire, motive and further assist students to harness critical reading, writing, speaking, and thinking skills regardless of their abilities. It also provides students with the opportunities to be stretched and challenged, while enjoying a broad selection of materials that span across decades. Students follow the AQA English specification course of study based holistically on two equally-balanced papers, each assessing reading and writing in an integrated way. This final year of the KS4 curriculum aims to synthesise all knowledge, key terms and skills for academic success in the GCSE examinations and for personal success in the future.
