GCSE Examinations

The timetable of public examinations for the summer series has now been published and commences the week beginning Thursday 9th MAY. It is of vital importance that each student attends college fully prepared for each examination that they are entered for at least 30 minutes before it is scheduled to commence. Students are required to attend all examinations in full college uniform and with the required equipment.

For Science and Mathematics examinations, students must have a calculator, ruler, pencil and a geometry set. Students must also bring a black biro to each examination.

The use of mobile telephones and other electronic devices are NOT PERMITTED in the examination hall.

Therefore, it is requested that students do not bring these items to college when they have an examination. If students do need to have any such devices with them, they must hand them to the invigilation staff at the start of each examination. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the examination.


Students must attend the examination(s) for which they have been entered for. In the event of illness or an emergency situation that prevents your child attending or means your child will be late, please make contact with the College as soon as possible so that appropriate advice can be given and arrangements put in place.

This is an online programme where your child can access both non-fiction and fiction texts to improve their reading skills and learn new vocabulary that will enhance the way they read, speak and write across all of their subjects. As your child progresses through the Bedrock curriculum, they will study hundreds of new words.

Research has shown that there is a direct link between a student's vocabulary size and their academic achievement. Children with a wider vocabulary make faster progress at school, in further education and beyond. Narrow vocabularies affect directly students' grades. The Bedrock core curriculum is accessed by every year 7 and 8 student during their weekly English lesson. Year 8 Examinations

All KS3C students will sit formal end of year examinations during the week commencing 1st - 8th May. During the time of the examinations all Year 8 students must attend college at the normal time of 8:45am each day. Students need to go directly to their Form Room for morning registration and will then either attend normal lessons or a timetabled examination, whichever is applicable. It is important for all students to bring the appropriate equipment i.e. pen, pencil and calculator to the examinations. It is important for students to note that no electronic device [e.g. phone, iPod, smart watches etc.] will be allowed into the examination venues. Such items must be left at home or handed in at the start of each examination. Please note that the college does not take responsibility for loss or damage to these items so I therefore strongly recommend that all mobile phones and electronic devices are left at home.
